In support of economic development, the College's Division of Workforce Development (<http://www.pdc.edu/workforce-development>) provides a full array of services to meet the needs of both new and existing employers including Customized Training; Open Enrollment Courses and Seminars; Business Start-up and Expansion Training; Consulting, Coaching, and Facilitation Services; Job Profiling and Job Candidate Assessment; Meeting and Training Facilities; and Videoconferencing Capabilities.

The College offers a number of industry training programs such as a 40-hour Essential Craft Skills course for Mechanical Maintenance personnel from the pulp and paper and chemical industries. Other examples of training areas/topics include

- Management and Professional Development (Change Management, Coaching, Customer Service, Supervisory Skills, and Team Building);
- Technology (Microsoft Office Applications, MOS, MCAS and IC3 Certifications);
- Industrial Technology (Electricity, Electronics, Heating and Air Conditioning, Industrial Maintenance, Warehouse and Distribution, and Welding)
- Safety
- Employment Readiness(Resume Writing, Interview Skills, and Basic Computer Training)
